## UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY GRADUATE PROGRAM IN BIOMEDICAL ENGINEERING Guidelines for Students with Non-Engineering Backgrounds

Applicants for admission to the Graduate Program in Biomedical Engineering must meet the general requirements of The Graduate School and are expected to hold a baccalaureate degree from an ABET accredited engineering program or its equivalent. Applicants with baccalaureates in other disciplines are considered on a case-by-case basis.

For students who do not have an engineering degree, we require that they take the following courses before becoming eligible for admission. The courses listed below are those offered at the University of Kentucky, however, equivalent courses completed at other institutions may be substituted. The first block of courses is common to many of the life and physical science curricula at the University of Kentucky. The second block provides additional mathematics and fundamental engineering course work. The third block is intended for enhancement of the prospective applicant's background in an engineering discipline that is of interest.
